## V'eleh Sh'mot, "These Are the Names"

As the night sky creeps earlier and earlier into our December days, we approach the winter solstice. Chanukah's candles will soon bring warmth and light into our homes, reminding us of our ancestors the

Maccabees' struggle to reclaim and rededicate their Holy Temple. We will consume a g'zillion potato latkes and will smell like oil for days (as will our kitchens - cooking hint: fry your latkes on an electric frying pan outside!), a scent which reminds us not only to exercise our bodies, but also our right to live freely and proudly as Jews, to identify ourselves as such, and to declare our ancestry and our names proudly.

At birth, Jews are given two names, our English name and a Hebrew or "Jewish" name. Bestowing Hebrew names upon our children joins them to their Jewish ancestors and binds them to an unbroken chain of tradition. Embedded in a Hebrew name is the person's link to the generation before them, and so through a *brit milah* or *brit bat* ceremony, a "naming," we welcome our children into the covenant of our heritage, the *Brit* established between Adonai our God and Abraham and Sarah in the Book of Genesis.

For a variety of reasons, some Jewish adults and children were never officially given Hebrew names. Sometimes, before a Bar or Bat Mitzvah, a parent will realize that s/he has no Hebrew name. When a *ketubah* is being prepared for a wedding, a groom or a bride will discover that s/he did not receive a Hebrew name. In the hospital, a rabbi prays a "*Mi shebeirach*" for healing for a congregant, and when he asks for the

patient's Hebrew name is told, "I don't have one; I didn't receive one." Besides meeting ritual Jewish needs such as these, a Hebrew name is a bridge to past and future generations, and is symbolic of our identity, our Jewish identity, as it shall be recorded in the chronicles of the People Israel and the unique histories of our own families.

In January, we will read the opening chapters of the Book of Exodus which begins, "*V'eleh sh'mot: these are the names of the Children of Israel.*" There, in the first column of text are the names of Jacob's sons who went down to Egypt. Their names are the names of the twelve tribes from whom we have descended even unto this day.

To enable those among us who are legacies of those tribes but who were never blessed with a Hebrew name, **we would be honored to bestow you with one and to do so at Shabbat services on Friday, January 8\*, *Par'shat Sh'mot*, the Sabbath when the Torah portion, *Sh'mot* ("Names") will be**

read. Regardless of your age, what a wonderful opportunity and occasion for you to reclaim a symbol of your own Jewish journey. We will gladly assist you in selecting an appropriate Hebrew name, and will, with much pride, formally bless you with that name during Shabbat services. To get started, complete the information on the form below, send it to Ruth Silverman in the rabbinic offices, and ***you will be contacted with further information and a reminder about the service.***

**\*January 8 will replace January 1 as our "Family-Friendly First-Friday" Shabbat service.**

We look forward to working together with you to continually add strength to your Jewish commitment and shine new lights on the Jewish future.

## Chanukah Blessings

***This year, on the first night of Chanukah, light your Menorah before you light Shabbat candles.***

**בְּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם, אֲשֶׁר קִדְּשָׁנוּ בְּמִצְוֹתָיו וְצִוָּנוּ לְהַדְלִיק נֵר שֶׁל חֲנֻכָּה.**

Baruch Atah Adonai Eloheinu Melech ha'olam asher kidshanu b'mitzvotav v'tsivanu lehadlik ner shel chanukah.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Ruler of the universe, who has sanctified us by Divine commandments, and has commanded us to kindle the lights of Hanukkah.

*This blessing is recited only on the first night or the first time one kindles the Hanukkah lights.*

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Ruler of the universe, who has kept us alive, and has preserved us, and enabled us to reach this time.

## Religious School

The last night of Hanukah always brings me mixed feelings. I love the light coming from the full *hanukiah*, but I also know that the next night there will be no candles, no blessings, and no extra light. Perhaps these conflicting emotions are part of the lesson of Hanukah. Each night we want more candles, more light. Then the holiday is over and we are left without even one candle in the window. We can't not light the candles to avoid that ninth-night let down, but we can appreciate the light from each candle and not wait until one day when it will be "bright enough."

This lesson of Hanukah also gives us December's Middah of the Month: *Sameyach B'chelko*—Being Content with One's Lot. For our children, and some adults, this time of year might be the most challenging for this particular virtue. Between advertisements for must-have gifts, neighbors' holiday decorations, and others' vacation plans December can be a difficult time to be satisfied with one's portion.

Of course, that makes December the perfect time to work on this *middah*. In the Talmud, the rabbis wrote: "When the camel demanded horns, they cut off its ears." (*Sanhedrin* 106a) In addition to explaining why the camel doesn't have horns, this teaching also reminds us to temper our desire for more by appreciating what we already have. It turns out that camels do have ears, but the rabbis' teaching still asks us to consider what part of ourselves we put at risk by not valuing our own assets sufficiently.

We know what happens when people don't appreciate the light from each candle or want horns instead of ears. They find it more and more difficult to be happy. It's not the work or the resulting wealth that leads to that end, but rather the mindset that leads to that end. Our *middah* this month, *Sameyach B'chelko*—Being Content with One's Lot, reminds us to follow a different path.

## TILMAD Focuses on Israel

Israel and the "Big Bang":  
 Can politics in the Jewish State become  
 non-ideological?



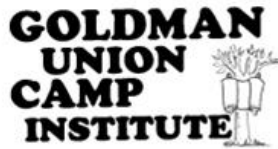

When the pull-out of Jewish settlements from Gaza was orchestrated by right-wing political icon Ariel Sharon, one politician referred to the "big bang": well-worn categories in Israel's political arena seemed to be shattering. Has Israeli politics lost its familiar ideologies, and if so, what does that mean for the future? Tracing the genesis of a possibly new sociopolitical alignment in Israel, Dr. Silver will survey recent events in Israeli-Palestinian affairs, religious-secular dialogue and other contexts.

## Volunteers Say “OK” to Kae Avenue Elementary School

Since 1996, Temple volunteers have mentored 4<sup>th</sup> graders, first at Columbus’ Main Street Elementary School & now at Whitehall’s Kae Avenue Elementary School – all in preparation for the State’s 4<sup>th</sup> Grade Proficiency Test. For some children, the tutoring relationship begins in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade and continues through 5<sup>th</sup> grade. For many of these students, we not only provide tutoring but also that much needed one-on-one time with a caring adult.

Bette Jo Stempel, original project chair for many years, turned over the project reins a few years ago. Temple members and friends of Temple volunteers serve weekly on Mondays, between Noon and 1 PM. Kae Avenue Elementary will begin building their new school next year – a good thing as the tutors and kids have definitely outgrown their space. Nonetheless, the tutoring program boasts a great caring group of people who probably get as much out of this association as the kids do.

After the children’s academic work is complete, one can even find the tutors spending an extra 10 minutes on the playground as the children expend energy swinging on the swings, hula-hooping or playing dodgeball.

In order to further help some of our Kae Avenue families, our tutors have implemented a new program this year to help out some

of the families who don’t have enough food to get through the weekend. With a tremendous amount of help from the 2<sup>nd</sup> graders at Temple Israel Religious School, nonperishable food items are put together for ten Kae Avenue families every other weekend. Thanks to all of the mentors and especially to the kids and families of the **Temple Israel’s 2<sup>nd</sup> grade class** for the generous food donations.
