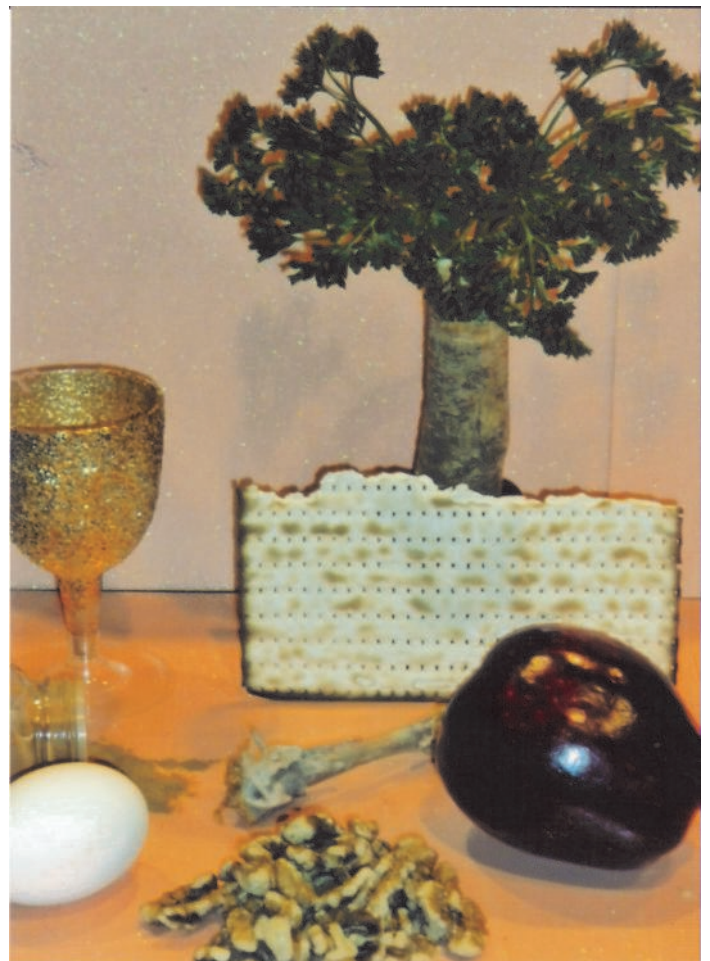

The Jewish people have several “new year” celebrations. The most familiar of course, is Rosh Hashana, which marks the creation of the universe and is therefore a “universal” new year. But it actually falls on the first day of the seventh month. The seventh month? Yes, the first month of the Hebrew calendar is Nisan, the month that coincides with spring. This makes sense from a natural perspective—it is the birth-month of nature, as well as from a historical-religious point of view—it is also the birth-month of the Jewish people.

In Nisan, we witness the earth’s burst of energy: animals naturally give birth to new offspring, wonderful springtime flowers begin their bloom, breathtaking scenes of green fields emerge, crops of wheat and barley spread their blankets as they sprout from the ground. In Nisan, we also are witnesses to our own people’s rise from the dust; we recall our ancestors who, like sprouts in a field, broke through the frozen fields of Egyptian slavery and crossed a green sea into freedom’s embrace. In Nisan, we observe an ancient and powerful tradition, the Passover Seder, when we gather our families and friends, assemble around tables adorned with spring’s symbols, and like so many generations before us, retell the story of Moses’ stand against Pharaoh and our journey to independence.

Nisan evokes one of the most memorable of Jewish experiences: the Pesach Seder. Of all of the festivals and holy days, this one is the most important family gathering. The Seder brings together the generations in a powerful way, because the ritual itself involves one generation’s storytelling of the great exodus of our people from their exile into their redemption. No matter how the story is told, slowly or quickly, seriously or with jokes and laughter, with song or in art, whether read from the Haggadah or told in our own words, one sentence from the tradition is always recited with great sincerity and solemnity: “I myself this night have experienced the exodus from Egypt.” It is a phrase etched on the soul of the Jewish people and an idea fundamental to Jewish identity.

Nisan and the festival of Passover test the power of the Hebrew expression, *le-dor va-dor*, from generation to generation. For in this expression of our heritage, we are challenged to take our places alongside our ancient parents who actually crossed the sea, stood together at Sinai, and entered the Land of Promise. At this season of Passover, we are asked to speak of this precious and delicate legacy of freedom to our children, and to our children’s children. Rabbi Jonathan Sacks, Chief Rabbi of England, reminds us that

freedom should not be taken lightly, and that preserving it requires vigilance. He notes that three times in the course of two chapters of the Book of Exodus, Moses tells the Israelites about their duties to tell the story. Even before they have left Egypt, he instructs them to bequeath to future generations the story of the events through which they were living. To gain liberty was just the work of one generation, but to sustain it is the work of a hundred generations. He writes, “forget it and you lose it.”

Through the ritual and symbols of the Pesach Seder, when our mouths tell the story and our tongues taste the bread of affliction, the bitter herbs of slave labor, and the sweetness of freedom, we educate and empower our children to take their rightful places in the chain of Jewish life so that they too will not take for granted the sweetness of redemption and the destiny of the Jewish people. They must learn what oppression looks like and feels like if they are to fight against it whenever they encounter it in their lives.

Have a wonderful Nisan, the birth-month of the year, a joyous Passover and delicious Seder meals. May they be filled with the warmth of family and peoplehood, and a vision of universal wholeness. The first night of Pesach, the evening of the Seder, is Monday, March 29, on the full moon of the first month, the 15th of Nisan. Happy Pesach!

ABOUT THE COVER:

The theme of the March cover is Passover. Charoset symbolizes the mortar with which the Jews, as slaves of Pharaoh in ancient Egypt, used to make bricks to build the store-houses and cities of Egypt. Just about all Jewish communities try to use ingredients for charoset that will liken the charoset color to the color of mortar. Jews in Salonika, Greece even add a pinch of ground brick to their versions of charoset so that the finished product contains actual mortar.

The Family of Sandi & Marc Morton uses the Ashkenazi charoset

recipe which calls for apples, walnuts, cinnamon, sweet Passover wine and honey or sugar. "When our kids were young, we made a paste from the charoset, and the kids covered sugar cubes with the paste to understand the task of brick-building."

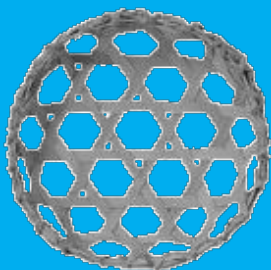

Lo Levayesh, Do Not Embarrass

If YouTube and reality television programming had been around in the first centuries of the common era, there would certainly be a rabbinic prohibition against watching it. It's not that the rabbis had anything against kittens pawing at piano keys or home improvement. They were however emphatically against embarrassing others. That concern for the honor and well-being of others leads to our March Middah of the Month: *Lo Levayesh, Do Not Embarrass*.

The rabbis' teachings on this topic range from ageless guidance from the Mishnah: "Rabbi Eliezer taught: Let your fellow's honor be as important to you as your own" (Pirkei Avot 2:10) to more adamant prohibitions in later literature. In the Talmud, embarrassing others is compared to a capital crime. "He who insults a person in public is morally as guilty as if he had shed blood" (Baba Metzia 58b). If the rabbis had their way there would never be a "Stars Without Their Makeup" magazine spreads.


And the rabbis were concerned with all sorts of embarrassments. They prohibited using derisive nicknames, reminding others of prior transgressions after *teshuvah* had been made, and even speaking ill of pagans in the company of a former pagan. Considering how little respect the rabbis had for idolatry, it is especially significant that they would show such regard for the honor of a convert to Judaism.

The basis of this concern for not embarrassing others is, like most Jewish virtues, *b'tzelem Elohim*. Each of us is created in God's image. To mock the "copy" is to insult the "Original". To laugh at the art is to demean the Artist. For the ancient rabbis there was no greater transgression than mocking, insulting, or demeaning God.

In our own time, we know the elements of our culture that thrive on the embarrassment of others (even with their permission) are rarely the best our society has to offer. Taking care not to embarrass a fellow human being is not only a way to be respectful of God, but is also a way to increase the good in our world.

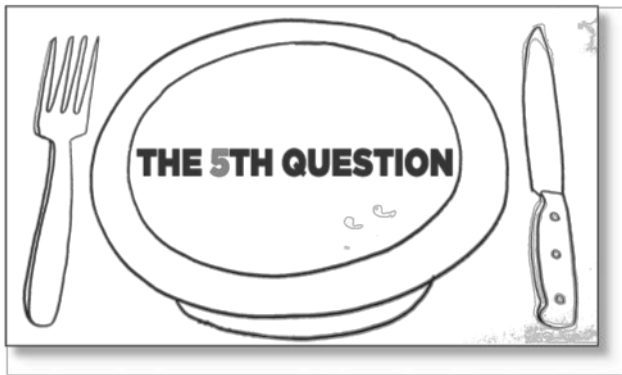

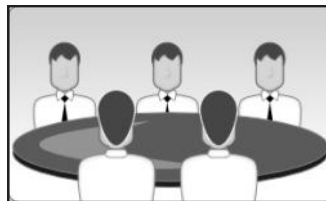
