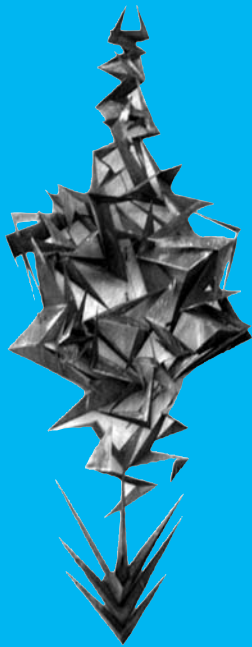

## TELL IT TO YOUR CHILDREN, AND DEEPEN YOURSELF

The Passover Haggadah, which retells the story of our journey from slavery to freedom, is essentially a commentary on this verse from Torah:

*You shall tell your child on that day, saying, "It is because of what Adonai did for me when I went out of Egypt."* (Exodus 13:8)

Although the basic outline of the Haggadah (which means "telling") is included in the Mishnah, the 2<sup>nd</sup> century primary text of the Talmud, the telling of the Passover story is a drama played out in Jewish homes every year at the time when the ground is thawing and the light of day increases. At the new moon of Nisan, the first month of the Jewish year and a time of earthly renewal, we put aside all things around us that are leavened and turn to the humble matzah. The lowly matzah is a physical reminder to make an effort to press down our egos and think of those who are yet to be free, free from oppression, free from slavery, free from tyranny and evil. We gather around carefully set tables and think about ways we ourselves are still enslaved, and pray for the courage to redeem those who are still in shackles.

We add to the telling of the Passover story our own experiences, our own redemptions, the narrow straits from which we, like our ancient ancestors, have escaped. Seder night (April 12) is a night of reflection, a night of once-a-year tastes and the weaving of a story of the birthing of the Jewish People with the stories of our families and ourselves. It is a night of play-acting, of hide-and-seek, of questions, of recalling the sounds of Seders past, of hearing the voice of a zayde or bubbe, or remembering the aroma of a mother's kitchen. It is a night of improvising on the sacred script of the Haggadah and a night when our own traditions, our own scents and voices emerge to create the next chapter in the history of our families and our people.

Create that chapter by making the Seder your own. Make this season of growth and light an occasion to bring forth your own light, stretch out the reach of your Jewish understanding and strengthen the grasp of your own power to bring about redemption. I pray that every Temple Israel member will celebrate Pesach by hosting a Seder, or seeking one out. Replace the leavening with matzah, affirming your identity and your history. May yours be a Passover of meaning and may you add to the deepening soul of the Jewish People.

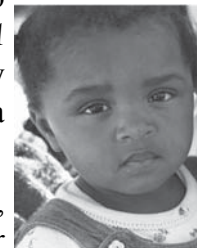

**ABOUT THE COVER:** The wine goblet pictured on the cover reminds us of the four cups of wine we are each required to drink at the seder table. While there is no clear reason for the four cups of wine, the most common explanation connects the four cups with the four expressions of redemption found in Exodus 6:67: "*I am the Lord. I will free you from the burdens of the Egyptians and deliver you from their bondage. I will redeem you with an outstretched arm...and I will take you to be My people...*"

Cathy Barnard's design is based on an engraved wine cup given to her grandfather by his parents. To Cathy, this cup symbolizes the importance of cherished family traditions and memories of family get-togethers of times past. Cathy is now the owner of the wine cup which will adorn the Barnard seder table.

## B.R.E.A.D. RISES !

On March 23, Temple Israel, following our prophetic tradition of *Tikkun Olam*, formally joined the B.R.E.A.D. organization. The mission of this coalition of over forty churches and synagogues is to draw together people of faith to act powerfully to address local community issues through processes of relationship building, direct action, and negotiation with decision-makers.

Already, B.R.E.A.D. has succeeded in getting Columbus and Franklin County to create the Columbus-Franklin County Affordable Housing Trust Fund which is helping low income families secure homes. It also lobbied the Columbus Public Schools to include the Direct Instruction (D.I.) reading program which raised the number of students passing the Fourth Grade reading test from 18% passing to 38% passing!

B.R.E.A.D. is now turning its' attention to education and youth issues. There will be a rally on **Tuesday, April 4, at 7:00 pm** at Oakley Full Gospel Baptist Church, 3415 El Paso Drive. On **Monday, May 8, at 6:15 pm.**, B.R.E.A.D. will hold its annual action meeting with selected public officials at Congregation Tifereth Israel, 1354 E. Broad Street. Since numbers speak loudly, we need to get as many Temple Israel members as possible to this May 8 meeting.

How can you help Temple Israel live up to its commitment to B.R.E.A.D.? What, in our Reform Jewish tradition, propels compels us to act on behalf of social justice? To ponder these questions, we hope you will join us on **Sunday, April 2, at 9:00 am** in the temple library to study texts with Rabbi Zinkow and plan for the May 8 action meeting.

The Committee's primary objective is to complete its review and make recommendations to the Board for the 2007/2008 fiscal year.

Other Committee members include **Seth Becker, Ted Bernard, Ron Mayer, Patti Shorr, and Ted Smiley.** **Jeff Ungar** and **Rabbi Zinkow** are ex-officio members of the Committee. It has been almost 5 years since the last review of membership contribution policies and procedures occurred. While Temple expenses have risen modestly over that time period, our membership contribution levels have remained flat. While it is likely that we will all see some modest increase in our minimum membership contribution expectation for next fiscal year, the Committee hopes to have a more comprehensive review and restructuring in place for 2007/2008. 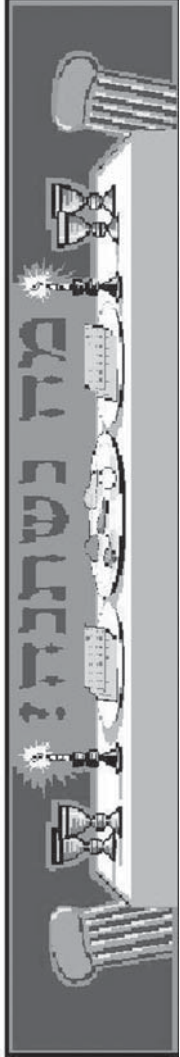

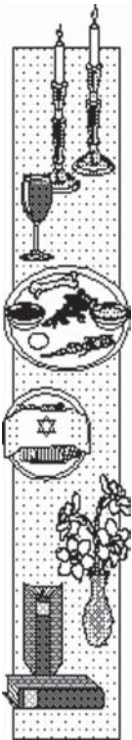
