Loving and Honoring One Another

Why is it that we do not recognize a good thing when we see it? Why do we take each other for granted? Do you remember to tell your children, your parents, your family, and your friends how much you love them, how special they are to you? Do you tell them?

On Valentines Day, American society goes crazy buying cards, candy, flowers, and gifts. When I was growing up, my dad would bring home a small red heart shaped box of candy for each of his girls and a really large heart for my mom. My sisters and I would anticipate what kind of chocolates Dad would bring us each year, and we would enjoy each bite, knowing that our dad loved us. As teenagers, my sisters and I would purchase flowers for our friends and if we received a red flower, we knew someone had a crush on us. And as a married woman, though I tell my husband it is "NOT NECESSARY" for him to buy me expensive red roses, or some pretty piece of jewelry, if he did not, he knows he would be in big trouble!

As Jews, should we celebrate a holiday with origins that have nothing to do with our religion? Like other holidays, there are various stories underlying the celebration of Valentines Day, Heart Day, or Lover's Day. The most common story regarding the origin of Valentines Day is that the holiday is supposed to honor a third century priest who defied the orders of the Roman Emperor Claudius II, who wanted to outlaw marriage. The Emperor's decree came as a result of the need for single men to become soldiers and not be obligated to another as a husband. Valentine, believing that the decree violated the will of God, continued to secretly perform marriages. Unfortunately, throughout the history of Eastern European Jewry, on Valentines Day, many thousands of Jews lost their lives due to anti-Semitic violence. This fact is important to acknowledge and not to forget. However, from a religious perspective, Jews are commanded by God to love one another, to honor one another, and to walk in God's loving embrace. Everything that Valentines Day represents in terms of love and the expression of such to another human being is a Jewish value.

No, we should not be worshipping St. Valentine or observing a religious holiday on February 14. Instead, focus on the message of the day - it should be a reminder to express our love not just on February 14, but every day. As Jews we sanctify time, for we must remember that every moment of every day counts. We cannot afford to take for granted any second with the people who fill our days. The Jewish religion teaches that we shall love the Eternal God with all our heart, with all our might and all our soul; we are to love ourselves and to love God as a model for our relationships with other human beings. Maimonides believed that, "Love may be an abstract concept, but deeds of love are concrete." He articulated that the commandment to "love your fellow man as yourself" is the basis for carrying out specific deeds. Ultimately, if we teach the history of what Valentines Day means to our people, if we focus on the message of loving and honoring one another, *Ohev Zeh et Zeh v' Mechabayd Zeh et Zeh*, then recognizing loved ones on February 14 and every day will only bring wholeness and a piece of God's loving embrace to our world.

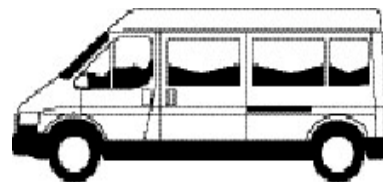

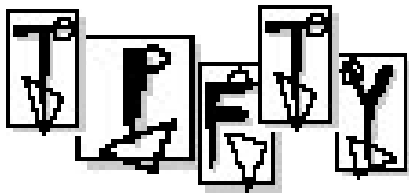

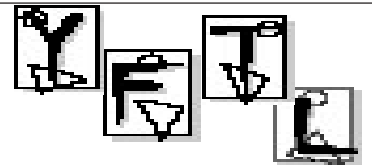

December 2003 Board Highlights

President's Report

Jeff Ungar reported on the Board Retreat on Saturday, December 13 and indicated that a Spring Board Retreat was in the planning.

Constitutional Change

A congregational letter will be mailed describing the constitutional change and the January Bulletin will also devote a page to this proposed change. The Board will vote on this at the January 6 Board Meeting before it is brought to the congregation for a vote at the Annual Meeting.

Parsonage

In keeping with IRS rules, Parsonage for clergy must be approved by the Board of Trustees prior to earnings being received for the calendar year. **Thus, the Board unanimously approved the Parsonage allowance as follows: \$15,000 for Rabbi Barnett J. Brickner and \$14,397.50 for Rabbi Deborah L. Lefton, effective January 1 – June 30, 2004.**

Sr. Rabbinic Search Committee Update

Fred Summer, co-chair of the Sr. Rabbinic Search Committee, praised the Search Committee for its dedication and hard work and indicated that the committee has been a pleasure to work with. He also thanked the Congregational Research Committee for framing the interview questions, for developing the survey and reporting the focus group results. He indicated that 13-14 resumes had been received from a pool of 24 rabbis. Eight were interviewed for 30-40 minutes via telephone. The field was narrowed to 5 candidates. Second phone interviews will be held, after which the committee will determine who they wish to bring in for personal interviews. Seyman Stern, co-chair of the Sr. Rabbinic Search Committee, stated that "we are approaching a critical point in the search process and encourage congregants to share their comments and ideas."

Board Nominating Committee

Susan Schubert reported that the Nominating Committee is being developed to re-instate three Board members. Representing the Board will be Bev Darwin, Phyllis Kingsley and Susan Schubert. Six representatives from the congregation need to be selected. Susan suggested congregants' names to be added to the Nominating Committee: Arnie Alpert, Greg Feldman-Hill, Laura Greenland, Elaine Pelz, Harvey Schwager, Babette Whitman. **Upon motion by Susan and second, the Board unanimously approved the appointment of these six congregants for the Nominating Committee.**

Finance

Harriette Hansell, treasurer, reported that, as of 10/31/03, income received was \$612,000 versus \$616,000 budgeted. Dues collection is down 3% (compared to down 9% reported last month). Religious School and Preschool are not meeting projected income.

Art Exhibit & Gala

Bev Darwin, chair, was presented with a Board-signed Art Exhibit PR poster, recognizing her efforts on this event. She reported the success of the program, earning \$7,700 – about \$1,600 more than two years ago – despite \$10,000 less in art sales and in Gala attendance. This was attributed to decreased expenses and increased sponsorships. A recent committee evaluation meeting pointed out the following: the event has value as a unified, festive, congregational event; the format of an Israeli art show is less viable (too similar a product to the art of two years ago). Future recommendations include: changing the time of year; a multi-faceted project featuring local artists, including sculpture, jewelry, boutique merchandise and a silent and live auction – or a combination.

Education

Ellen Mendel, chair, reported that Dennis Niekro is working on a community-wide teacher-training program with Jennifer Aaron from the Commission on Jewish Education as well as with the URJ Regional Educator, Rabbi Rachel Rembrandt. A Religious School policy handbook is being prepared.

Family Education

Barry Lubow, chair, reported that the Columbus Jewish Federation has approved a \$1,200 grant for Temple Israel for a four-part Adult Education program dealing with the "sandwich generation." Programming will begin in January.

"Meals on Wheels"

In a letter to the Board, Jeremy Simons, Jr. Youth Group advisor, recommended that Temple Israel "adopt a route" managed by LifeCare Alliance, one day per week as a Social Action project. By so doing, LifeCare Alliance would no longer pay a driver to deliver food; rather Temple Israel congregants would do this between two and three hours a week. A training session would take place. Jeremy has offered his services as a volunteer to organize and maintain this project. The Board unanimously approved this project.

Executive Director's Report

The congregation's 3-year insurance package will expire in December 2004. The new commercial dishwasher has been installed. Dee Dee Higgins, bookkeeper, injured at work due to a fall, has been released from the nursing home and is recuperating at home.

January 2004 Board Highlights

Constitutional Amendment

Jeff Ungar presented the Constitutional recommendation regarding the Senior Rabbi's Contract Provisions that had been presented to the Board in November, mailed to the Congregation in December and published in the January Bulletin.

The recommendation calls for the following:

Initial Sr. Rabbi Contract Term	Minimum of 2 yrs with maximum of 3 yrs
First Renewal	Minimum equal to initial contract term with maximum of 5 yrs
Second Renewal	Minimum equal to the first renewal with maximum of 5 yrs
Third (& Subsequent) Renewals	Minimum of at least 5 yrs with maximum of 7 yrs

Congregants present at the meeting were invited to address the board on this issue. Various opinions were expressed. **Upon motion and second, the above recommendation was unanimously approved by the Board and will be submitted to the Congregation for approval at the Annual Meeting.**

Mortgage

Brian Tuckerman reported that the refinancing of the \$2 million mortgage is in process with Fifth Third Bank. This will save Temple about \$35,000 over the 2-year term of the mortgage.

Senior Rabbinic Search Committee

Fred Summer, co-chair, reported that three candidates will receive in-person interviews.

Congregational Research Committee

Susan Schubert reported that a written report will be forthcoming. Ted Bernard, Chris Kloth and Sherry Linhart were thanked for their tremendous effort on the survey project.

Rabbi's Report

Rabbi Brickner reported on the "great success" of the Chanukah dinner, service and program, featuring Brian Zive and Jack Simon as a "nice blend." He indicated that the 4th Friday of the month will be a Family Alternative Service, occurring simultaneously to regular 8 pm services, and that every other month YFTL will participate in these services. Rabbi Brickner shared information about the Folkman Weekend, April 9-10, including Friday night's Classical Reform Shabbat service during which Cantor Lanie Katzew will be present, preceded by a special dinner. The Dedication of the Folkman Chapel will follow services and a Gala Oneg Shabbat will conclude the evening. There was a request that the organ be used that evening.

Rabbi Yoffie's Sermon

The Board 's "homework" had been to read and study Rabbi Eric Yoffie's Biennial sermon for discussion of the main points. It was generally agreed that Rabbi Yoffie doesn't wish to see Judaism "defined by anti-Semitism" for the best way to combat anti-Semitism is to support Israel and talk to others. Several members expressed that children of all ages need to be equipped to deal with anti-Semitism.

The Board pointed out that Adult Education is seriously lacking.

Education Committee Report

Ellen Mendel, chair, reported on a meeting with Dennis Niekro and Pamela Feldman-Hill regarding the URJ's Chai Curriculum, which will be implemented. An Education sub-committee is developing a policy manual for the Religious/Hebrew School which should be ready in May and will be brought to the Board at that time.

Family Education Committee

Barry Lubow, chair, indicated that the following programs are slated to take place: Bible Heroes; Kindergarten-First Grade *Tu B'Shevat* – 2/7; First Steps; Tot Shabbat – 2/14; Sandwich Generation programming in February; Havdalah Happenings in February and Heritage Fair Pre-School Fundraiser.

Executive Director's Report

HVAC - Sensors have been installed in the four columns in the Sanctuary to sense and distribute heat and air. The columns have been routed out, wiring installed, walls patched and repainted. Grants – Received first half of annual allocation of \$17,000 from the Columbus Jewish Federation for the Religious School program, grades K-12, based on enrollment and hours of participation. Received notification of approval of \$1,000 Library grant toward computerization of library from Columbus Jewish Foundation. Archives – Developing plan for Archive window display for Folkman Weekend. Planners include Laura Berger, Harriet Kallenberg, Becky Schedler, Sandy Ungar with professional input from Kim Feinknopf-Dorrian.

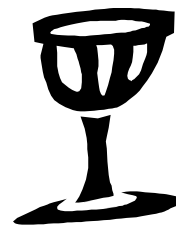

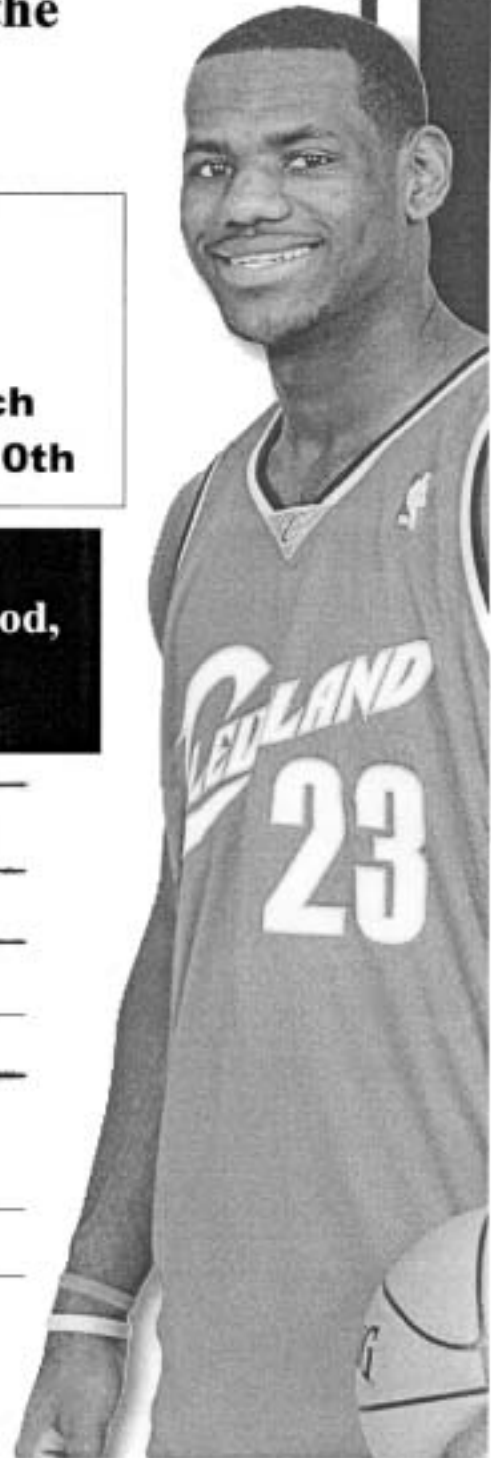

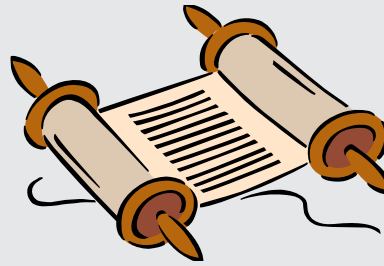
