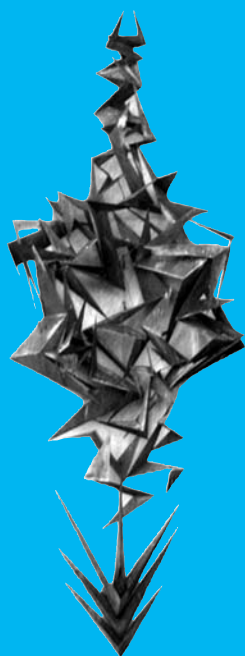

## TAKE AN EXTRA BREATH

There is a pace to these summer months for which we yearn the rest of the year. It is a slower step that allows us to linger a little longer, breathe from the bottom, and study a sunset with an appreciation for mystery and awe for the Creator of the Universe. Summer is a time for vacating the workplace a bit, enjoying our backyards and a neighborhood pick-up baseball game. Do kids still do that? ## LIKE TO SING?

### JOIN TEMPLE ISRAEL'S CHOIR



Music is in my blood—literally in my blood. My grandmother Madge Botnick (z"l) sang in a church choir in New Iberia, Louisiana (there were no Jewish choirs there, and barely enough Jews for a minyan, but hey, she wanted to sing!). My mother and I have both played the flute since childhood, my father (z"l) and sister were singers, my daughters sing in choir and theatre, and I have sung in choirs since high school.

Although Judaism is also in my blood, it wasn't until I began singing Jewish music in choirs about 12 years ago that I felt a personal and spiritual connection to Judaism for the first time. Jewish songs filled me with an unexpected kind of joy. Singing Jewish music led me to learn to read from the Torah on my Bat Mitzvah at the age of 35.

Music is a major part of our congregational community's Jewish experiences. Through music we feel the peacefulness of Shabbat, we remember the immigrant experiences of our ancestors through Yiddish songs, we remember the dreams children had for a life beyond the Holocaust, and we yearn to connect with generations of Jews in Israel through the music of the Zionist Movement. Our Jewish experiences would be hollow and unfulfilling without music. It raises our spirits, comforts our souls, and creates a collective rhythm.

Not surprisingly, Rabbi Zinkow's Yom Kippur sermon last fall struck a chord (excuse the pun) with me. In it, he talked about how music takes one to another state of consciousness and can arouse many different emotions. For a synagogue, he said, "The pulse of a strong congregation is measured by the beat of its worship." **For Temple Israel the pulse of our congregational worship will be uplifted over the next 18 months with Danny Maseng as our musical Artist-in-Residence. Under his direction, two congregational choirs are being created—an adult choir and a youth choir.** The adult choir will rehearse once a month and sing at services once a month. The children's choir will rehearse every Sunday morning during Religious School and will sing during services on the first Friday night of the month. These choirs will not perform for our passive listening pleasure—they will bring us new melodies, join us in familiar ones, and enrich our congregational worship and celebrations.

**Please consider joining these choirs.** Those of you who like to sing (and you know who you are) are encouraged to be a part of this new musical phase of Temple Israel. We will share and learn beautiful Jewish liturgy through music with Danny. I think I'm the first to sign up. I can't wait to start singing again, and I promise you it will be an amazing (and addictive) musical experience. Religious School families will hear more about the children's choir with registration materials. 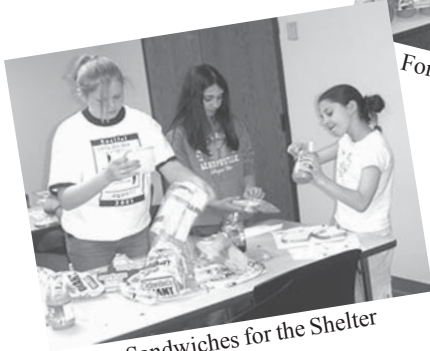

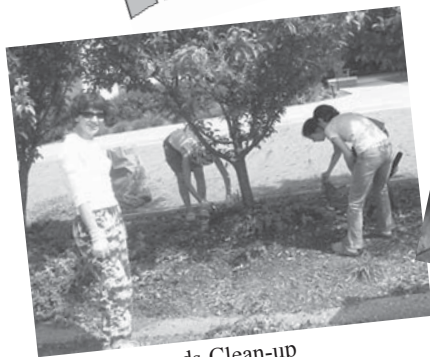

### SAEMAN YOUTH FUND TO PROVIDE ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIPS
